Section A:

In the light of the Vision and Mission of the college IQAC intend to accomplish the following goals during the year.

- 11) To conduct orientation programmes for administrative staff. The accountant and head clerk of the college attended such programmes conducted outside the college.
- 12) To organize inter-intra-institutional seminars and workshops on quality related matters: the college organized state and national level seminars and workshops funded by UGC and ICSSR.
- 13) To conduct student oriented programmes and activities: certificate courses were conducted by the departments of Commerce, Economics and Psychology..
- 14) Field trips were organized for the benefit of students of the following subjects: Commerce, Sociology, Psychology and Geography.

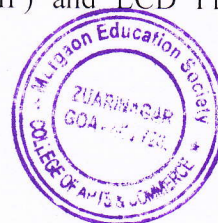
The motto of M.E.S. College is 'Quality Enhancement in Higher Education'. The IQAC of the college has set high goals for the college and strives at excelling in all fields such as curriculum, teaching, learning and evaluation, research, consultancy, extension and other related aspects. The curriculum caters to the integration of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) by giving good foundation in the core subjects. The Wi-Fi internet facility has been made available to the students and teachers of the college.

The degree courses available to the students in this college are:

- a) Bachelor of Arts.
- b) Bachelor of Commerce.
- c) Bachelor of Business Administration.(BBA)
- d) Bachelor of Business Computer Application(BCA)
- e) Bachelor of Commerce in Shipping Management(BSM)

Beside, some certificate courses are being conducted in order to impart job oriented skills to the students.

The Teaching-Learning process has been confined primarily to the blackboard and chalk method, but in recent years the teaching method has changed with the installation of Overhead Projector (OHP) and LCD Projectors. This makes the



lectures more interesting, easy to comprehend and informative. Seminars are conducted by different departments which make the learning process simpler and rewarding.

The student's council is elected every year and the office bearers shoulder quite a few responsibilities. They prove their mettle during the college week where a variety of programmes, functions and competitions are organized and conducted by the students under the able guidance of the teachers. A Placement Cell has been established in the college.

In order to be abreast with the latest developments in the field of education, the college deputed the teachers to organize and attend seminars, workshops, refresher courses and orientation courses. Eight teachers are pursuing their research for Ph.D.

The library has, as of today, a total collection of 23073 books and subscribes to 71 periodicals and 15 local & national newspapers. During this academic year, 811 books were added to the library collection. 511 books were purchased under UGC Remedial Coaching Grant. There is internet facility in our library. The college is a member of INFLIBNET.

It has always been the desire of the IQAC to work together with the management to bring out the best for the college.

24. Feedback from stakeholders: all the stakeholders oopinions are considered important and their problems are solved.

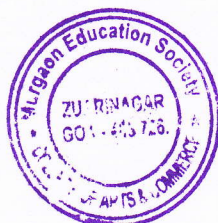
