These rights were bestowed on people of India by passing Consumer Protection Act which today plays a major role in protecting the interest of the consumers.

Shri. Roland Martins also spoke about built in provisions of Grievance Mechanism in Government offices, banks etc. wherein on a specified date in a month, designated officers are available for the redressal of the grievances of the consumers.

Shri. Roland Martins is also in the area of Road Safety and has been making significant Contributions in promoting road safety through use of seat belts, helmets etc. among the youths of Goa. He highlighted GOACAN role in strengthening the consumer movement in Goa in collaboration with educational institutions.

He warned audience to be more cautious about Online/ digital frauds where there are greater chances of looting the consumers.

The talk was followed by very lively questions and answers session. The talk was attended by staff and students of MES College and also residents of in and around Murmugao taluka.
