#### Rules:

- The participants can parade around the campus and the character who has a major impact on the audience, will be selected by the judges, as the winner
- Each contestant is also given a final 2-minute slot for their performance onstage, where they should be creative and engage the crowd
- The costumes and props should be 50% handmade
- The participants should inform Ms. Michelle D'Mello and Ms. Priscilla David from the Department of English, about their chosen character
