50 Years of the College

The journey of Murgaoon Education Society began on 23rd August 1971, under the Chairmanship of late Shri Vasanttrao Joshi and several enlightened persons, in the Joshi building at F. L. Gomes Road, Vasco-da-Gama. The College was started in 1972. It was established to serve the youth of Goa, particularly the youth from the Port Town, with affordable and high-quality education.

The College was shifted to its current campus in Zuarinagar, in June 1985. Since then, the barren Zuarinagar plateau has undergone significant transformation. In order to provide quality education to the students of the Port Town, a Higher Secondary School with 4 streams: Arts, Commerce, Science, Vocational and an Institute of Management Studies were set up subsequently. The College section initially began with BA and BCOM programs and expanded to a Computer Applications Course, as well as the Course in Management, the BCA and BBA (General) programs were introduced. An industry specific Diploma course in Shipping Management was instituted which has now been replaced with a Graduate degree (BBA) in Shipping & Logistics. A Postgraduate Degree, MCOM was also introduced in 2016.

With the initiation of measures like afforestation, rainwater harvesting, vermicompost and the recent installation of solar panels, the College provides an eco-friendly environment to our faculty, students and visitors. The infrastructure of the College grew at a steady pace over the years.

Over the last 50 years, the College and Higher Secondary Section have been the alma mater for many young men and women from humble economic and social backgrounds. The alumni have indeed risen to great heights and excelled in fields, ranging from education to banking, business to public administration, rendering their service to society and Goa.

The College has had a smooth transition from the traditional 'chalk and blackboard' method, to the OHP method and more recently, to Audio-visual teaching and the use of the LCD Projector. The college has further advanced in terms of technological progress, with the launching of Smartboards in some classes. The College has also gone a step ahead in extending the use of the campus to the community at large. It has allowed people in the vicinity to utilize the infrastructure and facilities, such as, the Basketball court, library, etc, while also being a venue for professional examinations.

The flag of MES continues to fly high, with achievements by the Faculty in several areas of research, expertise and Co-curricular activities. Our students have excelled in NSS, NCC Navy and Army, as well as in Sports.

The College is in its Golden Jubilee year and has been renamed as '*MES Vasant Joshi College of Arts & Commerce – Zuarinagar*', to honour the philanthropic work of our Founder, Late Shri. Vasanttrao S. Joshi.

This year with the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP 2020), the future of education seems more innovative and flexible for the students to choose their courses.

The road ahead for the next 50 years proves to be very promising with the help of the Management, Faculty and students.

Murgaon Education Society's Vasant Joshi College of Arts & Commerce is one of the premier institutions of higher education in the state of Goa. The college was founded by the great visionary and philanthropist Late Shri. Vasant Subrai Joshi to cater to the need of educational upliftment of youth in Vasco- da- Gama in particular and the state of Goa in general. The College premises was shifted to the present campus in 1985. Over the years, the campus has been transformed from barren, rocky and unyielding land into a lush green, fertile paradise where students aspire to pursue their higher studies.

It was one of the first composite Arts and Commerce colleges in the state of Goa to be affiliated to the University of Mumbai and then to Goa University. The college is currently offering five undergraduate programmes in Arts, Commerce, B.C.A., B.B.A. (General), B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) and one postgraduate programme, namely M.Com. To cater to the requirements of the Shipping and Logistics industry, M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College introduced B.Com. (Shipping Management) which was initially funded by UGC for five years and is currently running as self-financed programme as Bachelor of Business Administration (Shipping & Logistics).



The B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) programme is the first undergraduate programme in India which addresses the commercial and managerial side of the shipping industry. At present, the college has approximately 1534 students and 69 full-time teaching faculty.



The college encourages high academic standards. We instil in our students a passion for learning and acquiring knowledge that they will require to make a positive contribution to the society. The college imparts learner-centric education which aims at the holistic development of the students by developing creative and critical thinking, nurturing innovations and excellence, developing professional skills etc.

ADMISSION

I) PROCEDURE: *

(A) Undergraduate Programme - Arts & Commerce Semester I & II

The admission process will be managed in online mode through the Integrated Academic Information Management System (IAIMS) Portal of the Directorate of Higher Education DHE, Government of Goa. Candidates aspiring to seek admission should register themselves on the IAIMS portal. Upon registration on the IAIMS portal, the students will be able to generate login credentials required to login to the IAIMS portal for all future correspondence.

1. The Admission link is available on the college website <https://www.mescollege.org/> and Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) website <https://dhe.goa.gov.in/>
2. Gmail ID is mandatory to begin the admission process.
3. The following documents are required to be uploaded during the admission process: -
 - a. A passport size photo of the candidate and signature of the candidate (not exceeding 1 MB and in .jpg format).
 - b. Scanned copy of original marksheet of SSC/ Equivalent examination

- c. Scanned copy of original marksheet of HSSC/ Equivalent examination
 - d. Scanned copy of original Leaving Certificate/ Transfer Certificate
 - e. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed standard XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable)
 - f. Scanned copy of original Caste Certificate/Physical Disability/Economically Weaker Section, if applicable
4. Each Candidate is allowed to make only one application per stream on the admission portal.
 5. Only students selecting our college as the first preference will be considered while preparing the merit list.
 6. After completion of the online process, students will be called for counselling in the college. The students will be contacted via email and the merit list will be uploaded on the college website
 7. The student has to be present with the following documents
 - a. Print copy of online admission
 - b. 3 passport sized photographs
 - c. Original and photocopy of SSC marksheet/ Equivalent examination
 - d. Original and photocopy of HSSC marksheet/ Equivalent examination
 - e. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed standard XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable)
 - f. Photocopy of original Caste Certificate/Physical Disability/Economically Weaker Section, if applicable
 - g. Original and self-attested copy of Aadhar card
 - h. Bank Passbook and self-attested photocopy of the first page
 - i. Undertaking by the students, Undertaking by the parents, and Undertaking for discipline and attendance (The Undertakings will be given during the counselling session)
 8. The student should pay the admission fees after the counselling and subject allocation. Fees may differ according to the subjects selected.
 9. Admission will be confirmed only after full payment of fees. Failure to submit the necessary documents will lead to cancellation of admissions
 10. **For applicants who are not shortlisted in the first round of admission:**
 - a. Applicants may get a chance in the second round of admission, depending on the availability of seats.
 - b. The commencement of the second round of admission will be notified on the college website.

(B) The Admission procedure for the rest of the Semesters under NEP will be updated shortly according to the ordinance and notifications received from Goa University and Directorate of Higher Education (DHE).

Note: No Student shall be given admission after the date specified by Goa University.

II) ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Eligibility for admission leading to the Undergraduate Programme in Arts & Commerce shall be as follows.

2.1 Eligibility for admission to Semester I & II (First year)

- (A) To be eligible for admission to the Semester I of the Undergraduate Programme the candidate should have passed:
- (i) The Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in any stream, including Vocational stream in the subjects notified by the University from time to time.
- OR
- (ii) Standard XII Arts/Science/Commerce or similar examination of another body, equivalent to Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Goa, and recognized as such by Goa University.
- (B) A candidate not covered under any of the above categories but desirous of seeking admission to the said course may apply to the College. However, the Registrar along with the Dean of concerned Faculty and Chairperson(s) of Board(s) of Studies of concerned subjects shall decide the eligibility.
- (C) A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-II.
- (D) A candidate migrating from another recognized University and desirous of direct admission to Semester-II may be considered for admission provided he/she has cleared/passed First Term/ Semester-I examination of that University with those subjects for which admission is sought and undertakes to successfully complete the other compulsory Courses of Semester-I.

2.2 Eligibility for admission to the rest of the Semesters

Refund of Caution Money

Application for refund of caution money must be made within six months of the applicant ceasing to be a student of the college i.e. from the last day of the previous academic year, failing which the caution money will be forfeited.

Refund of fees shall be governed by the following circular of Goa University:

The refund of fees will be in accordance with Goa University Circular No. GU/130/Acad-PG/Refund-of-Fees/327 dated 26/11/2019.

- (a) If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the following five-tier system shall be followed for the refund of fees remitted by him/her.

- (b) Caution Deposit and Security Deposit shall be refunded in full.
- (c) In case of (1) in the table above, 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000 shall be deducted as processing charges from the refundable amount.
- (d) Fees shall be refunded to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.
- (e) The fees of students who have already been admitted to a programme of the University and have paid the fees and are subsequently admitted to another programme shall have to pay the fees for the final admission and claim the refund of fees paid earlier, in which case no administrative charges shall be deducted from fees paid earlier by the student. However, if the fees payable for both the programmes are the same, the fees paid earlier shall be transferred to the final programme where admission is sought.
- (f) All the other cases of refund of the fees will be decided on case to case basis on its merit.

CODE OF CONDUCT

3. Students have to abide by all the rules and regulations framed from time to time by the principal or by the persons authorized by him/her.
4. Insubordination to any teacher or to any college authorities, use of indecent language, misbehaviour or misconduct is liable for disciplinary action as per the rules.
5. Ragging is strictly banned in the college. Any student found indulging in ragging will be severely dealt with, as per UGC Regulations.
6. Wearing of Identity card is mandatory for students in the college premises. Loss of an identity card must be reported to the College Office immediately. A duplicate card will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.

Objectives, Roles and Responsibilities of College Internal Complaints Committee

1. Prevent discrimination and sexual harassment, by promoting gender amity among students and employees;
2. Deal with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the victimized and termination of the harassment; The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 came into being after it was passed in the Parliament of India.

It should be noted that according to the Supreme Court guideline Sexual harassment can be defined as “unwelcome” sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

1. Physical contact and advances;
2. Demand or request for sexual favours;
3. Sexually coloured remarks;
4. Showing pornography; and
5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature. (Vishaka judgment by Supreme Court)

- **The following is also sexual harassment and is covered by the Committee:**

- Eve-teasing
- Unsavory remarks,
- Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,
- Innuendos and taunts,
- Gender based insults or sexist remarks,
- Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like,
- Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- Forcible physical touch or molestation and
- Physical confinement against one’s will and any other act likely to violate one’s privacy.

The Committee shall meet as often as may be needed and appropriate.

Students are motivated to take part in various extra-curricular activities.

1. Department of Physical Education and Sports

The Department of Physical Education and Sports of M.E.S Vasant Joshi College aims at all round development of each and every student through the participation in various games and sports. The Department organizes various activities and intra-murals such as Inter-class Tournaments, Athletic Meet, which provides an opportunity to the students to showcase their talents. The College also participates in other extra-murals and competitive games held by the Goa University and other associations and Institutions.



The College Director of Physical Education & Sports, Dr. Savio Fernandes and Instructor in Physical Education, Shri. Gauresh Kamat provides scientific fitness training and coaching to the students representing the college at various competitions. The individuals are not only trained for performance and medals but they are also credited with values and discipline. The College has also developed

a Sports Policy and the sports department ensures that the Sports Policy is being implemented in the college. Other benefits such as Sports Merit Marks, Duty Leave, Practice Allowance, Travelling Allowance and Kit Allowance as per the guidelines of the University are provided to the students. Due recognition is also given to the students who achieve glory in sports by forwarding the reports to the local newspaper

- Indoor Gymkhana for Indoor Sports Activities like Badminton, Table-Tennis and Chess.

2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a voluntary community service scheme for the youth studying in the higher educational institutions. The aim of NSS is to bring out a positive social and political change in the lives of youth by developing various dimensions of their personality. NSS volunteers are made socially, emotionally, politically and environmentally sensitive towards the process of nation building. The NSS Unit organizes a 7 day residential 'Annual Special Camp' in a rural area.

All students are encouraged to enrol for NSS. A student joining NSS shall complete 240 hours of NSS regular activity over a period of four semesters completing 60 hours of regular N.S.S activity per semester and one 7 days residential 'NSS Annual Special Camp'.



On successful completion of the above activities, the NSS volunteer shall become eligible to receive a 240 hours completion certificate, issued by Directorate of sports and Youth Affairs, Campal, Panaji, Goa. The NSS Volunteers who complete 60 hours of NSS activity, participation in Annual Special camp, National and international Camps are awarded entitlement marks.

3. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

There are 3 divisions/ wings of NCC in M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College viz, **Army Boys Wing, Army Girls Wing and Naval Wing**. Army Boys Wing and Naval Wing are available for boys (SD) and girls (SW). NCC is open to all regular students of the college on a voluntary basis. Total training period is three years. The cadets have to appear for 'B' certificate exam after completion of two years and 'C' certificate exams after three years of training. NCC provides a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces. Free SSB guidance is provided to interested cadets. NCC provides uniform, washing allowance, refreshments during the parade, T.A., D.A. for attending camp, free messing and boarding during camps.

Special weightage and reservation are granted to all NCC 'B' and 'C' certificate passed cadets in armed forces, central paramilitary forces and all the state police forces



4. Activities organized by Various Associations/Cells and Departmental Associations /Clubs

The College Council, various associations and cells such as the Debating Association, Association of Art and Culture, Literary Association, Women's Cell and Departmental Associations organize co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for the benefit of students.

FACILITIES

The College offers the following facilities on the campus:

Library: The College Library is automated using KOHA Software. The Library has a total collection 44055 of Books, 54 Periodicals (Magazines/Journals). Library Subscribes to 16 Local and National Newspapers.

The Library is a Member of UGC INFLIBNET NLIST Programme which gives access to E-books and e-Journals. The college Library has registered for the National Digital Library. The Library Facilities are also extended to the public. The Library has Book Bank Facility wherein set of Textbooks are given to needy and meritorious students. Students are given two library cards to borrow books for a period of 08 days. Rules and Regulations of the Library are displayed on the Library Notice Board.

Laboratories: The college has well-equipped laboratories, namely, IT Lab, Psychology Lab and Economics Lab.



Sports: The sports facilities include gymnasium, gymkhana/ multi-purpose hall for indoor games, football ground, volleyball court and two basketball courts.



Stationery Shop: The college has a stationery shop which also provides photocopying and printing facilities.

Cafeteria: We now have our very own open-air cafeteria on campus ‘MESCAFÉ’ which provides a student friendly ambience.

Canteen: The College has a spacious canteen offering snacks and lunch.

Counselling: The services of two full-time counselors are available for the benefit of students in areas of counselling such as career guidance, family issue, peer pressure, addiction etc. The counselors are available on all days of the week from 8.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m.

Health Centre: The College has a Health Centre which is equipped with a bed, first aid box and wheel chair facilities. A private physician visits on a weekly basis.

Wi-Fi: The campus is Wi-Fi enabled and accessible to both staff and students.

Transport arrangement: KTC buses are available at concessional fares.
