- either of the Parties, receiving such information shall be referred to as 'Recipient Party'.

The Recipient Party shall use the confidential information of the provided by the Disclosing Party solely in accordance with the provisions of this MOU and will not disclose or permit to be disclosed, the same, directly or indirectly, to any third party without the Disclosing Party's prior written consent.

The Recipient Party shall exercise all care and caution in protecting the confidential information provided by the Disclosing Party, from any unauthorized use and disclosure. However, neither party bears any responsibility for safeguarding information which:

- i) is publicly available,
- ii) obtained by the other party from third parties without restrictions on disclosure.
- iii) independently developed by the other party without reference to confidential information, or
- iv) required to be disclosed by order of a court or other law enforcement entity, provided written notice of such compelled disclosure before court or law enforcement entity is intimated to the Disclosing Party.

ARTICLE VI: Governing Law, Jurisdiction & Arbitration

- This MOU shall be construed, interpreted and enforced in accordance with Laws of India.

- Subject to the Arbitration Clause, the Courts competent jurisdiction at Delhi shall have exclusive jurisdiction in respect of any and all matters pertaining to this MOU.

1. Objectives of MoU:

- b) To establish faculty and student exchange programmes between MES College and R.A. Podar College.
- c) To provide technical assistance for enhancement of quality of education at MES College and R.A. Podar College including usage of ICT facilities.
- d) To promote research/continuing education, curricular, cocurricular and extra-curricular activities between Institutes.

2. Technical areas of collaboration:

a) Provide academic interaction by delivering special lectures at MES College and R.A. Podar College on relevant topics.

- b) Provide necessary help and collaborations wherever applicable in organizing conferences / seminars / workshops / and personality development / life skill programmes / FDP between Institutes for enhancement of skills in respect of staff and students.
 - c) Cooperate in activities such as placements, Job-Melaprogrammes, etc.

Proposed modes of collaboration:

- e) To give preference to staff and student participants of either institutes.



- f) This MoU may be amended, renewed and terminated by mutual written agreement of the Institutes at any time.
- g) Either institute shall have the right to terminate this MoU upon 30 days prior written notice to the other institute.
- h) On mutual consent of both the Institutes, review meetings will be conducted once in three months with Co-coordinators and Principals.

5. Confidentiality:

- The First and Second Party will jointly develop a research collaborations in the fields inclusive education and Psychoeducational Research.


D. Responsibilities:

The First Party will

Be a guiding force being a long-established organization for the First Party which is in its Nascent State and

- a) allow student teachers of Second Party to participate any Project as deemed fit by Second Party

- provide the Second Party and/or its members, student support wherever needed, for minor data collection.

The Second Party will

- b) provide students of the First Party opportunities to participate as volunteers for such programs, which will help them meet and network with educational experts from Goa as well as from all over the country
- involve the faculty members and students of the First Party in any research project that it might undertake
- d) provide resource persons / speakers from amongst its members for workshops / conferences / seminars / webinars organized by the First Party
- encourage its members to provide internships and on-the-job training opportunities to students of the First Party
- f) upon request from the First Party, identify from among its members, possible Guest Faculty based upon their areas of expertise, and encourage these members to participate as Guest Faculty





E. Coordination

The Parties shall each appoint a Coordinator who will have the responsibility of implementing the MoU, carrying out periodic reviews, and finding ways to strengthen the collaboration between the two Parties

F. Terms and Termination

- 1. This MoU will take effect from the date it is signed by representatives of the two Parties. It will remain valid for a period of two years, and may be continued thereafter after suitable review and agreement.
- 2. This MoU may, at any time during its period of validity, be terminated by one of the Parties upon prior notice to the other in writing not later than six months before the termination date. Once terminated, neither Party will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other Party may suffer. However, both Parties will ensure that all activities in progress are allowed to complete successfully,
- Any cooperation under this MoU is subject to the availability of funding sources.

 - 3. Any cooperation under this MoU is subject to the availability of funding sources.
 - In the event that either Party wishes to disclose any data and/or information supplied in or resulting from the implementation of this MoU, the disclosing Party shall have prior written consent from the other Party.
 - Any dispute concerning the interpretation and/or application of this MoU shall be settled amicably through consultation between the Parties.
 - This MoU may be amended or revised at any time by mutual written consent of the Parties, and such amendment shall form an integral part of this MoU.

G. General

- This MoU may only be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of each party.
- The Parties may disclose certain confidential information to the other in relation to any future proposal made under this MoU. Non-disclosure agreements will be made for each such event between the individuals involved from both institutions.



Report on Alternate Sources of Energy and Energy Conservation Measures

1. Solar Energy

Installation of Solar Lights in the College Campus

- The college has installed Solar Street Lights with the main purpose of using solar energy as it is a renewable energy and does not generate any pollutants, making us less dependent on conserving energy sources.
- The Solar Street Lights illuminate the pathways of the campus and the common area, thereby contributing to save electricity and helping in environmental sustainability.

The college campus has a total of five solar street lights.

2. Use of LED bulbs / Power efficient equipment

- The institution has replaced traditional bulbs and tubes with LED bulbs and tubes in order to conserve energy.
- Also, in order to save electricity, the college buys only LED Computer Systems.

A total of 533 LED bulbs and tubes are fitted throughout the college campus (class-rooms, laboratories, office, corridors, library etc.) till the year 2022-23.

39 new LED tubes were purchased during the academic year 2022-23 out of which 13 tubes were installed in the college library and the remaining were installed in the staffroom and the classrooms.
