Murgaon Education Society's Vasant Joshi College of Arts & Commerce is one of the premier institutions of higher education in the state of Goa. The college was founded by the great visionary and philanthropist Late Shri. Vasantrao Subrai Joshi to cater to the need of educational upliftment of youth in Vasco- da- Gama in particular and the state of Goa in general. The College premises was shifted to the present campus in 1985. Over the years, the campus has been transformed from barren, rocky and unyielding land into a lush green, fertile paradise where students aspire to pursue their higher studies.

It was one of the first composite Arts and Commerce colleges in the state of Goa to be affiliated to the University of Mumbai and then to Goa University. The college is currently offering five undergraduate programmes in Arts, Commerce, B.C.A., B.B.A. (General), B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) and one postgraduate programme, namely M.Com. To cater to the requirements of the Shipping and Logistics industry, M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College introduced B.Com. (Shipping Management) which was initially funded by UGC for five years and is currently running as a self-financed programme as Bachelor of Business Administration (Shipping & Logistics).





The B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) programme is the first undergraduate programme in India which addresses the commercial and managerial side of the shipping industry. At present, the college has approximately 1601 students and 69 full-time teaching faculty.

The college encourages high academic standards. We instil in our students a passion for learning and acquiring knowledge that they will require to make a positive contribution to the society. The college imparts learner-centric education which aims at the holistic development of the students by developing creative and critical thinking, nurturing innovations and excellence, developing professional skills etc. At M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College, we believe in holistic education that comprises deep as well as broad academic and co-curricular exposure. Hence, academics is always complemented with co-curricular and extra-curricular activities in the campus.

### ADMISSION

### I) PROCEDURE: \*

The online application process will commence from 27th May 2024, 11.00 am onwards. The first round of the online application process will remain open until 7th June 2024, midnight. Each candidate applying for UG program is required to register only once on the Samarth portal. Candidates can apply to any number of colleges and programs of their choice. Candidates can apply to multiple programs in same college as well.

### (A) Undergraduate Programme - Arts & Commerce Semester I & II

The admission process will be managed in online mode through the Samarth Portal of the Directorate of Higher Education DHE, Government of Goa. Candidates aspiring to seek admission should register themselves on the Samarth portal.

- 1. The Admission link is available on the college website <u>https://www.mescollege.org/</u> and Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) website <u>https://dhe.goa.gov.in/</u>
- 2. Gmail ID is mandatory to begin the admission process.
- 3. The following documents are required to be uploaded during the admission process:
  - a. A passport size photo of the candidate and signature of the candidate (not exceeding 1 MB and in .jpg format).
  - b. Scanned copy of original marksheet of SSC/ Equivalent examination
  - c. Scanned copy of original marksheet of HSSC/ Equivalent examination
  - d. Scanned copy of original Leaving Certificate/ Transfer Certificate
  - e. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed standard XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable)
  - f. Scanned copy of original Caste Certificate/Physical Disability/Economically Weaker Section, if applicable
- 4. Only students selecting our college as the first preference will be considered while preparing the merit list.
- 5. After completion of the online process, students will be called for document verification in the college. The students will be contacted via email and the merit list will be uploaded on the college website
- 6. The student has to be present with the following documents
  - a. Print copy of online admission
  - b. 3 passport sized photographs
  - c. Original and photocopy of SSC marksheet/ Equivalent examination
  - d. Original and photocopy of HSSC marksheet/ Equivalent examination
  - e. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed standard XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable)
  - f. Photocopy of original Caste Certificate/Physical Disability/Economically Weaker Section, if applicable
  - g. Original and self-attested copy of Aadhar card
  - h. Bank Passbook and self-attested photocopy of the first page
  - i. Undertaking by the students, Undertaking by the parents, and Undertaking for discipline and attendance (The Undertakings will be given on the day of document verification)
- 7. The student should pay the admission fees after the counselling and subject allocation. Fees may differ according to the subjects selected.
- 8. Admission will be confirmed only after full payment of fees. Failure to submit the necessary documents will lead to cancellation of admissions

## (B) The Admission procedure for the rest of the Semesters under NEP will be updated shortly according to the ordinance and notifications received from Goa University and Directorate of Higher Education (DHE).

Note: No Student shall be given admission after the date specified by Goa University. \* Subject to change

### **II) ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION**

## Eligibility for admission leading to the Undergraduate Programme in Arts & Commerce shall be as follows.

### **2.1** Eligibility for admission to Semester I & II (First year)

- (A) To be eligible for admission to the Semester I of the Undergraduate Programme the candidate should have passed:
  - (i) The Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in any stream, including Vocational stream in the subjects notified by the University from time to time.

#### OR

- (ii) Standard XII Arts/Science/Commerce or similar examination of another body, equivalent to Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Goa, and recognized as such by Goa University.
- (B) A candidate not covered under any of the above categories but desirous of seeking admission to the said course may apply to the College. However, the Registrar along with the Dean of concerned Faculty and Chairperson(s) of Board(s) of Studies of concerned subjects shall decide the eligibility.
- (C) A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-II.
- (D) A candidate migrating from another recognized University and desirous of direct admission to Semester-II may be considered for admission provided he/she has cleared/passed First Term/ Semester-I examination of that University with those subjects for which admission is sought and undertakes to successfully complete the other compulsory Courses of Semester-I.

### 2.2 Eligibility for admission to the rest of the Semesters

### **Refund of Caution Money**

Application for refund of caution money must be made within six months of the applicant ceasing to be a student of the college i.e. from the last day of the previous academic year, failing which the caution money will be forfeited.

### **Refund of fees shall be governed by the following circular of Goa University:**

The refund of fees will be in accordance with Goa University Circular No. GU/130/Acad-PG/Refund-of-Fees/327 dated 26/11/2019.

(a) If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the following five-tier system shall be followed for the refund of fees remitted by him/her.

- (b) Caution Deposit and Security Deposit shall be refunded in full.
- (c) In case of (1) in the table above, 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000 shall be deducted as processing charges from the refundable amount.
- (d) Fees shall be refunded to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.
- (e) The fees of students who have already been admitted to a programme of the University and have paid the fees and are subsequently admitted to another programme shall have to pay the fees for the final admission and claim the refund of fees paid earlier, in which case no administrative charges shall be deducted from fees paid earlier by the student. However, if the fees payable for both the programmes are the same, the fees paid earlier shall be transferred to the final programme where admission is sought.
- (f) All the other cases of refund of the fees will be decided on case to case basis on its merit.

# **CODE OF CONDUCT**

- 1. In every matter relating to the college, the decision of the principal shall be final and binding upon every student.
- 2. Attendance for lectures and practical's is compulsory. The minimum requirement for attendance is 75% aggregate and 50% in each course of the respective semester as per Ordinance OA-17 of the Goa University.
- 3. Students have to abide by all the rules and regulations framed from time to time by the principal or by the persons authorized by him/her.
- 4. Insubordination to any teacher or to any college authorities, use of indecent language, misbehaviour or misconduct is liable for disciplinary action as per the rules.
- 5. Ragging is strictly banned in the college. Any student found indulging in ragging will be severely dealt with, as per UGC Regulations.
- 6. Wearing of Identity card is mandatory for students in the college premises. Loss of an identity card must be reported to the College Office immediately. A duplicate card will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.
- 7. Students are expected to strictly adhere to lecture timings. The lectures are conducted from 8.15 a.m. to 2.35 p.m. and practicals are conducted up to 4.30 p.m. The college office timings are from 09.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.
- 8. Damage to college property/reputation in any form is punishable. If found guilty, responsible individual(s) would be liable to pay for the damages in addition to repercussion faced.
- 9. Students are required to adhere to the Examination Ordinance of Goa University. Please refer to the Goa University Ordinance OA-38(4) available at: <u>https://www.unigoa.ac.in/uploads/confg\_docs/20231010.111219~Ordinances\_Part\_A\_-10-Oct-23.pdf</u>
- 10. Students shall require prior permission from the principal for organizing/ involvement in any activity (monetary/non-monetary in nature) in the college premises.
- 11. Consumption and possession of tobacco or alcohol or any form of intoxicant in the college campus is prohibited and punishable.
- 12. A student applying for medical Leave must produce a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner within seven days of resuming classes.
- 13. The entry of outsiders to the college campus is prohibited and punishable.
- 14. Students are expected to clear/pay their dues (sports, library, other damages etc.) before collecting their results. On failing to do so, the college reserves the right to withhold the Examination result.
- 15. Students should not involve in unethical practices such as **smoking, drinking alcohol**, **consumption of drugs, other unethical practices** and shall adhere to dress code.
- 16. Parents/Guardians are advised to contact the College authorities/Class mentors from time to time in order to apprise themselves of the progress of their wards and their attendance.
- 17. Use of unfair means during examination (ISA/SEE) is strictly prohibited. A student, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment as per the rules prescribed by Goa University. The minimum punishment is the cancellation of the entire semester.
- 18. Unauthorized use of mobile phones in class is strictly prohibited. Any student violating this rule shall face disciplinary action.
- 19. Security personnel or any staff appointed by the principal will have full authority to check and verify the identity cards of every student and have right to interrogate any student, in view of security concerns of the college.

Maintenance of college discipline, adherence to its rules and code of conduct and obedience to the instruction issued from time to time by the principal or other college authorities will be mandatory and binding on each student. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken which includes suspension/expulsion and rustication as per the directives of Goa University and College Discipline Committee.

- 1. Prevent discrimination and sexual harassment, by promoting gender amity among students and employees;
- 2. Deal with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the victimized and termination of the harassment; The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 came into being after it was passed in the Parliament of India.

It should be noted that according to the Supreme Court guideline Sexual harassment can be defined as "unwelcome" sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

- 1. Physical contact and advances;
- 2. Demand or request for sexual favours;
- 3. Sexually coloured remarks;
- 4. Showing pornography; and

5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature. (Vishaka judgment by Supreme Court)

### • The following is also sexual harassment and is covered by the Committee:

- Eve-teasing
- Unsavory remarks,
- Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,
- Innuendos and taunts,
- Gender based insults or sexist remarks,
- Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like,
- Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- Forcible physical touch or molestation and
- Physical confinement against one's will and any other act likely to violate one's privacy. The Committee shall meet as often as may be needed and appropriate.

The NSS Unit organizes a 7 day residential 'Annual Special Camp' in a rural area.

All students are encouraged to enrol for NSS. A student joining NSS shall complete 240 hours of NSS regular activity over a period of four semesters completing 60 hours of regular N.S.S activity per semester and one 7 days residential 'NSS Annual Special Camp'.

### **3. National Cadet Corps (NCC)**

There are 3 divisions/ wings of NCC in M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College viz, Army **Boys Wing, Army Girls Wing and Naval** Wing. Army Boys Wing and Naval Wing are available for boys (SD) and girls (SW). NCC is open to all regular students of the college on a voluntary basis. Total training period is three years. The cadets have to appear for 'B' certificate exam after completion of two years and 'C' certificate exams after three years of training. NCC provides a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces. Free SSB guidance is provided to interested cadets. NCC provides uniform, washing allowance, refreshments during the parade, T.A., D.A. for attending camp, free messing and boarding during camps.



On successful completion of the above activities, the NSS volunteer shall become eligible to receive a 240 hours completion certificate, issued by Directorate of sports and Youth Affairs, Campal, Panaji, Goa. The NSS Volunteers who complete 60 hours of NSS activity, participation in Annual Special camp, National and international Camps are awarded entitlement marks.

Special weightage and reservation are granted to all NCC 'B' and 'C' certificate passed cadets in armed forces, central paramilitary forces and all the state police forces



**4.** Activities organized by Various Associations/Cells and Departmental Associations /Clubs The College Council, various associations and cells such as the Debating Association, Association of Art and Culture, Literary Association, Women's Cell and Departmental Associations organize co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for the benefit of students.

# **FACILITIES**

The College offers the following facilities on the campus:

**Library:** The College Library is automated using KOHA Software. The Library has a total collection 35577 of Books, 41 Periodicals (Magazines/Journals). Library Subscribes to 17 Local and National Newspapers.

The Library is a Member of UGC INFLIBNET NLIST Programme which gives access to Ebooks and e-Journals. The college Library has registered for the National Digital Library. The Library Facilities are also extended to the public. The Library has Book Bank Facility wherein set of Textbooks are given to needy and meritorious students. Students are given two library cards to borrow books for a period of 08 days. Rules and Regulations of the Library are displayed on the Library Notice Board.

**Laboratories:** The college has well-equipped laboratories, namely, IT Lab, Psychology Lab and Economics Lab.



**Sports:** The sports facilities include gymnasium, gymkhana/ multi-purpose hall for indoor games, football ground, volleyball court and two basketball courts.



**Stationery Shop:** The college has a stationery shop which also provides photocopying and printing facilities.

**Cafeteria:** We now have our very own open-air cafeteria on campus 'MESCAFE' which provides a student friendly ambience.



**Canteen:** The College has a spacious canteen offering snacks and lunch.

**Counselling:** The services of two full-time counselors are available for the benefit of students in areas of counselling such as career guidance, family issue, peer pressure, addiction etc. The counselors are available on all days of the week from 8.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m.

**Health Centre:** The College has a Health Centre which is equipped with a bed, first aid box and wheel chair facilities. A private physician visits on a weekly basis.

**Wi-Fi:** The campus is Wi-Fi enabled and accessible to both staff and students.

**Transport arrangement:** KTC buses are available at concessional fares.




