It was one of the first composite Arts and Commerce colleges in the state of Goa to be affiliated to the University of Mumbai and then to Goa University. To cater to the requirements of the Shipping and Logistics industry, M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College introduced B.Com. (Shipping Management) which was initially funded by UGC for five years and is currently running as a self-financed programme as Bachelor of Business Administration (Shipping & Logistics).






The B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) programme is the first undergraduate programme in India which addresses the commercial and managerial side of the shipping industry. At present, the college has approximately 1471 students and 59 full-time teaching faculty.

ADMISSION

I) PROCEDURE: *

All the admissions of B.A./B.COM. programme for FY/SY/TY will be accepted through Samarth portal.The dates of admission will be intimated on the college website <u>https://www.mescollege.edu.in/</u>. Each candidate applying for UG program is required to register only once on the Samarth portal. Candidates can apply to any number of colleges and programs of their choice. Candidates can apply to multiple programs in same college as well.

(A) Undergraduate Programme - Arts & Commerce Semester I & II

The admission process will be managed in online mode through the Samarth Portal of the Directorate of Higher Education DHE, Government of Goa. Candidates aspiring to seek admission should register themselves on the Samarth portal.

- 1. The Admission link is available on the college website <u>https://mescollege.edu.in/</u> and Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) website <u>https://dhe.goa.gov.in/</u>
- 2. Gmail ID is mandatory to begin the admission process.
- 3. The following documents are required to be uploaded during the admission process:
 - a. A passport size photo of the candidate and signature of the candidate (not exceeding 1 MB and in .jpg format).
 - b. Scanned copy of original marksheet of SSC/ Equivalent examination
 - c. Scanned copy of original marksheet of HSSC/ Equivalent examination
 - d. Scanned copy of original Leaving Certificate/ Transfer Certificate
 - e. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed standard XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable)
 - f. Scanned copy of original Caste Certificate/Physical Disability/Economically Weaker Section, if applicable
- 4. Only students selecting our college as the first preference will be considered while preparing the merit list.
- 5. After completion of the online process, students will be called for document verification in the college. The students will be contacted via email and the merit list will be uploaded on the college website
- 6. The student has to be present with the following documents
 - a. Print copy of online admission
 - b. 3 passport sized photographs
 - c. Original and photocopy of SSC marksheet/ Equivalent examination
 - d. Original and photocopy of HSSC marksheet/ Equivalent examination
 - e. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed standard XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable)
 - f. Photocopy of original Caste Certificate/Physical Disability/Economically Weaker Section, if applicable
 - g. Original and self-attested copy of Aadhar card
 - h. Bank Passbook and self-attested photocopy of the first page
 - i. Undertaking by the students, Undertaking by the parents, and Undertaking for discipline and attendance (The Undertakings will be given on the day of document verification)
- 7. The student should pay the admission fees after the counselling and subject allocation. Fees may differ according to the subjects selected.
- 8. Admission will be confirmed only after full payment of fees. Failure to submit the necessary documents will lead to cancellation of admissions

Note: Any change in the admission procedure will be informed via college website. Students are requested to visit college website regularly.

(B) The Admission procedure for the rest of the Semesters under NEP will be updated shortly according to the ordinance and notifications received from Goa University and Directorate of Higher Education (DHE).

Note: No Student shall be given admission after the date specified by Goa University. * Subject to change

II) ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Eligibility for admission leading to the Undergraduate Programme in Arts & Commerce shall be as follows.

2.1 Eligibility for admission to Semester I & II (First year)

- (A) To be eligible for admission to the Semester I of the Undergraduate Programme the candidate should have passed:
 - (i) The Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in any stream, including Vocational stream in the subjects notified by the University from time to time.

OR

- (ii) Standard XII Arts/Science/Commerce or similar examination of another body, equivalent to Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Goa, and recognized as such by Goa University.
- (B) A candidate not covered under any of the above categories but desirous of seeking admission to the said course may apply to the College. However, the Registrar along with the Dean of concerned Faculty and Chairperson(s) of Board(s) of Studies of concerned subjects shall decide the eligibility.
- (C) A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission to Semester-II.
- (D) A candidate migrating from another recognized University and desirous of direct admission to Semester-II may be considered for admission provided he/she has cleared/passed First Term/ Semester-I examination of that University with those subjects for which admission is sought and undertakes to successfully complete the other compulsory Courses of Semester-I.

2.2 Eligibility for admission to the rest of the Semesters

Refund of Caution Money

Application for refund of caution money must be made within six months of the applicant ceasing to be a student of the college i.e. from the last day of the previous academic year, failing which the caution money will be forfeited.

Refund of fees shall be governed by the following circular of Goa University:

The refund of fees will be in accordance with Goa University Circular No. GU/130/Acad-PG/Refund-of-Fees/327 dated 26/11/2019.

(a) If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the following five-tier system shall be followed for the refund of fees remitted by him/her.

Sr. No.	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is served to the College/University	% of refund Aggregate fees*
1.	15 days or more before the formally notified last date of admission.	100%
2.	Less than 15 days before the formally - notified last date of admission.	90%
3.	15 days or less after the formally - notified last date of admission.	80%
4.	More than 15 days but less than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission.	50%
5.	More than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission.	00%

*(Inclusive of tuition fees and non-tuition fees but exclusive of Caution Deposit and Security Deposit)

- (b) Caution Deposit and Security Deposit shall be refunded in full.
- (c) In case of (1) in the table above, 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs.
 5,000 shall be deducted as processing charges from the refundable amount.
- (d) Fees shall be refunded to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.
- (e) The fees of students who have already been admitted to a programme of the University and have paid the fees and are subsequently admitted to another programme shall have to pay the fees for the final admission and claim the refund of fees paid earlier, in which case no administrative charges shall be deducted from fees paid earlier by the student. However, if the fees payable for both the programmes are the same, the fees paid earlier shall be transferred to the final programme where admission is sought.
- (f) All the other cases of refund of the fees will be decided on case to case basis on its merit.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. In every matter relating to the college, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding upon every student.
- 2. Attendance for lectures and practical's is compulsory. The minimum requirement for attendance is 75% aggregate and 50% in each course of the respective semester as per Ordinance OA-17 of the Goa University.
- 3. Students have to abide by all the rules and regulations framed from time to time by the principal or by the persons authorized by him/her.
- 4. Insubordination to any teacher or to any college authorities, use of indecent language, misbehaviour or misconduct is liable for disciplinary action as per the rules.
- 5. Ragging is strictly banned in the college. Any student found indulging in ragging will be severely dealt with, as per UGC Regulations.
- 6. It is compulsory for all students to wear the college uniform in the college premises. The students must adhere to the dress code and ensuring students faces remain visible at all times for identification and discipline purpose.
- 7. Wearing of Identity card is mandatory for students in the college premises. Loss of an identity card must be reported to the College Office immediately. A duplicate card will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.
- 8. Students are expected to strictly adhere to lecture timings. The lectures are conducted from 8.15 a.m. to 2.35 p.m. and practicals are conducted up to 4.30 p.m. The college office timings are from 09.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.
- 9. Damage to college property/reputation in any form is punishable. If found guilty, responsible individual(s) would be liable to pay for the damages in addition to repercussion faced.
- 10. Students are required to adhere to the Examination Ordinance of Goa University. Please refer to the Goa University Ordinance OA-38(4) available at: <u>https://www.unigoa.ac.in/uploads/confg_docs/20231010.111219~Ordinances_Part_A_10-Oct-23.pdf</u>
- 11. Students shall require prior permission from the principal for organizing/ involvement in any activity (monetary/non-monetary in nature) in the college premises.
- 12. Consumption and possession of tobacco or alcohol or any form of intoxicant in the college campus is prohibited and punishable.
- 13. A student applying for medical Leave must produce a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner within seven days of resuming classes.
- 14. The entry of outsiders to the college campus is prohibited and punishable.
- 15. Students are expected to clear/pay their dues (sports, library, other damages etc.) before collecting their results. On failing to do so, the college reserves the right to withhold the Examination result.
- 16. Students should not involve in unethical practices such as **smoking, drinking alcohol**, **consumption of drugs, other unethical practices** and shall adhere to dress code.
- 17. Parents/Guardians are advised to contact the College authorities/Class mentors from time to time in order to apprise themselves of the progress of their wards and their attendance.
- 18. Use of unfair means during examination (ISA/SEE) is strictly prohibited. A student, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment as per the rules prescribed by Goa University. The minimum punishment is the cancellation of the entire semester.
- 19. Unauthorized use of mobile phones in class is strictly prohibited. Any student violating this rule shall face disciplinary action.

20. Security personnel or any staff appointed by the principal will have full authority to check and verify the identity cards of every student and have right to interrogate any student, in view of security concerns of the college.

Maintenance of college discipline, adherence to its rules and code of conduct and obedience to the instruction issued from time to time by the principal or other college authorities will be mandatory and binding on each student. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken which includes suspension/expulsion and rustication as per the directives of Goa University and College Discipline Committee.

- 1. Prevent discrimination and sexual harassment, by promoting gender amity among students and employees;
- 2. Deal with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the victimized and termination of the harassment; The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 came into being after it was passed in the Parliament of India.

It should be noted that according to the Supreme Court guideline Sexual harassment can be defined as "unwelcome" sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

- 1. Physical contact and advances;
- 2. Demand or request for sexual favours;
- 3. Sexually coloured remarks;
- 4. Showing pornography; and

5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature. (Vishaka judgment by Supreme Court)

- The following is also sexual harassment and is covered by the Committee:
- Eve-teasing
- Unsavory remarks,
- Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,
- Innuendos and taunts,
- Gender based insults or sexist remarks,
- Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like,
- Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- Forcible physical touch or molestation and

• Physical confinement against one's will and any other act likely to violate one's privacy. The Committee shall meet as often as may be needed and appropriate.

1. Department of Physical Education and Sports

Further the students are given benefits such as Duty leave for participation in practice sessions and tournaments approved by the college, Sports Merit marks and other financial benefits such Practice allowance, dearness allowance, kit allowance and travelling allowance.

2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

Through these programs, the NSS unit continues to empower students by providing a platform to connect with society, identify real-world challenges, and contribute to meaningful solutions. 3. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

There are 3 divisions/ wings of NCC in M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College viz, Army **Boys Wing, Army Girls Wing and Naval** Wing. Army Boys Wing and Naval Wing are available for boys (SD) and girls (SW). NCC is open to all regular students of the college on a voluntary basis. Total training period is three years. The cadets have to appear for 'B' certificate exam after completion of two years and 'C' certificate exams after three years of training. NCC provides a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces. Free SSB guidance is provided to interested cadets. NCC provides uniform, washing allowance, refreshments during

The Library Facilities are also extended to the public. The Library has Book Bank Facility wherein set of Textbooks are given to needy and meritorious students. Students are given two library cards to borrow books for a period of 08 days. Rules and Regulations of the Library are displayed on the Library Notice Board.

Laboratories: The college has well-equipped laboratories, namely, IT Lab, Psychology Lab and Economics Lab.



Sports: The sports facilities include gymnasium, gymkhana/ multi-purpose hall for indoor games, football ground, volleyball court and two basketball courts.



Stationery Shop: The college has a stationery shop which also provides photocopying and printing facilities.




