Murgaon Education Society's Vasant Joshi College of Arts & Commerce is one of the premier institutions of higher education in the state of Goa. The college was founded by the great visionary and philanthropist Late Shri. Vasant Subrai Joshi to cater to the need of educational upliftment of youth in Vasco- da- Gama in particular and the state of Goa in general. The College premises was shifted to the present campus in 1985. Over the years, the campus has been transformed from barren, rocky and unyielding land into a lush green, fertile paradise where students aspire to pursue their higher studies.

It was one of the first composite Arts and Commerce colleges in the state of Goa to be affiliated to the University of Mumbai and then to Goa University. The college is currently offering five undergraduate programmes in Arts, Commerce, B.C.A., B.B.A. (General), B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) and one postgraduate programme, namely M.Com.. To cater to the requirements of the Shipping and Logistics industry, M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College introduced B.Com. (Shipping Management) which was initially funded by UGC for five years and is currently running as a self-financed programme as Bachelor of Business Administration (Shipping & Logistics).



The B.B.A. (Shipping and Logistics) programme is the first undergraduate programme in India which addresses the commercial and managerial side of the shipping industry. At present, the college has approximately 1471 students and 59 full-time teaching faculty.



The college encourages high academic standards. We instil in our students a passion for learning and acquiring knowledge that they will require to make a positive contribution to the society. The college imparts learner-centric education which aims at the holistic development of the students by developing creative and critical thinking, nurturing innovations and excellence, developing professional skills etc.

The **M.Com. programme** offered by the college is a two-year full time degree programme affiliated to Goa University. At present the M.Com. programme offers specialisation in Accounting and Finance only. The M.Com. programme is based on the existing course structure for the same programme offered by Goa Business School, Goa University.

### **ADMISSION**

#### **I) PROCEDURE: \***

##### **(A) For M. Com. Semester I & II**

1. Challan to be collected from college administrative section (Accountant), payment to be made, scan copy of payment made to be attached to challan, fill Google form submit online and print to be submitted to accountant.
2. The application form shall be filled online at [www.mescollege.org](http://www.mescollege.org)
3. Students should have a Gmail account.
4. A passport size photo (not exceeding 1 MB) should be uploaded.
5. The admission form shall be uploaded along with the following documents (each document not exceeding 1 MB):
  - a) Scanned copy of original mark sheet of B.Com examination and two self-attested photocopies of the same.
  - b) Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University (for those students who have passed B.Com examination through any other recognized University other than Goa University if applicable)
  - c) Scanned copy of original Aadhar card and first page of the bank pass book
  - d) Scanned copy of original caste certificate
  - e) Undertaking by the student
  - f) Undertaking by the parent
  - g) Undertaking for discipline attendance
6. Identity Card Slip
7. Six copies of recent passport size photographs
8. Once the admission form is filled and the relevant documents are uploaded, the student will be taken to the online payment gateway for payment of fees.
9. The student will receive an email on successful payment of fees confirming his/her admission.

- 7) The student will receive an email on successful payment of fees confirming his/her admission.

## **II) Eligibility for Admission [OA-20.6.7 Goa Business School (c) of GU Ordinance]**

**2.1** The eligibility criteria for admission to the M.Com.. Programme are as under:

1. Candidates must pass the Bachelor of Commerce Degree examination of Goa University or any other recognized university with a minimum of 45% marks.
2. Candidates must pass the Entrance Examination conducted by Goa University.
3. Admission is based on the ranking at Entrance Examination conducted by Goa University
4. A candidate admitted for Semester-I shall be deemed eligible for admission for Semester II.

### Refund of Caution Money

Application for refund of caution money must be made within six months of the applicant ceasing to be a student of the college i.e. from the last day of the previous academic year, failing which the caution money will be forfeited.

**Refund of fees shall be governed by the following circular of Goa University:**

The refund of fees will be in accordance with Goa University Notification No: GU/Acad-Admissions/CAC/2026-27/96 dated 18/02/2026

- (a) If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the following five-tier system shall be followed for the refund of fees remitted by him/her.

<b>Sr. No.</b>	<b>Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is served to the College/University</b>	<b>% of refund Aggregate fees*</b>
1.	15 days or more before the formally notified last date of admission. #	100%
2.	Less than 15 days before the formally - notified last date of admission.	90%

4.	30 days or less, but more than 15 days after the formally notified last date of admission.	50%
5.	More than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission.	0%

- (b) In case of (1) in the table above, 5% of the aggregate fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000/- shall be deducted as processing charges from the refundable amount.
- (c) All other cases of refund of fees will be decided on a case-to-case basis on its merit.
- (d) The Seat Confirmation Fee is fully refundable in case of withdrawal of provisional admission within 30 days from the last date of admission.
- (e) Admission Fees shall be fully refundable in case a candidate fails to qualify the UG Examination within 60 days from the last date of admission.

## **SEMESTER - I**

### **COM-5000 Advanced Financial Management**

This course is designed to provide fundamental knowledge about the company's finances and management. It shall enable the students to understand the financial decision-making process to enhance shareholders' wealth, and understand the techniques of financial management and apply the methods in financial decision-making. Also, to understand the impact of distribution of Dividend among shareholders on Firms growth.

### **COM-5001 Advanced Corporate Accounting**

The objective of the course is to enable students to understand and prepare financial statements of companies, banking, and insurance entities in accordance with relevant statutory requirements and regulatory formats. To provide knowledge of accounting for business combinations, including the procedures and methods for amalgamation and reconstruction of companies, along with the preparation of post-restructuring financial statements. To familiarize students with the legal and accounting procedures involved in the liquidation of companies, including the preparation of the statement of affairs and the liquidator's final statement of account. To develop the ability to prepare consolidated financial statements by understanding the relationship between holding and subsidiary companies and applying relevant consolidation adjustments.

### **COM-5002 Entrepreneurship and Venture Capital**

This paper shall help the students to acquire knowledge about evolution of entrepreneurial activities. To understand the significance of various resources required [emphasizing on venture capital financing]. To assess the potential business ideas based on business plans. To learn about business life cycles for entrepreneurs as well as venture capitalists, and to identify

the potential required for becoming one of the growth agents for socio-economic transformation, namely, entrepreneurs, intrapreneurs or joining with government.

### **COM-5003 Organizational Behaviour**

The objective is to introduce the fundamentals of individual behaviour within organizations and to explain conflict and stress management techniques in the workplace. It also aims to explore group dynamics, informal leadership, and organizational politics, while helping learners understand counselling methods and change management processes.

### **COM-5201 Capital Markets and Stock Exchange Operations**

The objective is to understand the structure and functions of primary and secondary capital markets in India and to explain the trading, settlement, and listing processes across major Indian stock exchanges like BSE and NSE. It also focuses on analyzing the construction, purpose, and methodologies of stock market indices, while enabling learners to evaluate the risk management and surveillance systems adopted by Indian stock exchanges to protect investor interests.

### **COM-5004 Financial Services Operations**

The objective is to explain the growth, structure, and classification of financial services and credit rating agencies, while also describing the concept, process, and legal aspects of securitization in India. It further aims to examine the structure, functioning, and regulations of the depository system in India, and to familiarize students with the operations, services, and core activities related to depository accounts and transactions.

## **SEMESTER - II**

### **COM-5004 Marketing and Consumer Behaviour**

The objective is to understand the evolution of business around the world and its impact on global GDP over the years, while also enabling learners to understand and analyse the basic marketing system over time. It further emphasizes understanding the significance of consumer behaviour and recognizing the role and importance of carrying out successful marketing research.

### **COM-5005 Direct Taxes**

This course aims at providing the students with a comprehensive introduction to Income Tax to enable them to compute income from different sources and calculate tax liability for individuals and corporate.

### **COM-5006 Security Analysis & Portfolio Management**

The objective is to enable students to understand the analysis of return and risk of securities and to analyze the equity and debt instruments of companies. It also aims to help students study and select a portfolio, as well as evaluate portfolio performance and revise their portfolios accordingly.

### **COM-5007 Cost and Management Accounting**

The objective is to provide a thorough understanding of cost and management accounting principles, concepts, and systems, while developing the ability to apply cost control techniques and perform cost-volume-profit and breakeven analysis for business decision-making. It also aims to enable the interpretation and analysis of financial statements using comparative, common-size, trend, ratio, and cash flow analysis, and to familiarize students with contemporary developments in accounting, including environmental, social, and human resource accounting. Additionally, it seeks to enhance critical thinking and problem-solving skills through the application of accounting tools in real-world business scenarios.

### **COM-5205 Financial Derivatives**

The objective is to introduce the fundamentals and applications of financial derivatives and to enable an understanding of risk management through derivative instruments. It also aims to equip students with practical knowledge of futures, forwards, options, and swaps, while helping them analyze derivative strategies aligned with portfolio and corporate finance.

### **COM-5206 Management of Mutual Funds**

The objective is to explain the fundamental concepts, roles, and benefits of mutual funds and to classify their various types. It also aims to describe the structure, organization, and regulatory framework for setting up mutual funds in India, while analyzing the components and significance of mutual fund offer documents including SID, SAI, and KIM. Furthermore, it seeks to familiarize students with various investor services and investment plans offered under mutual funds.

## **SEMESTER - III**

### **COM-6000 Research Methodology**

This course is designed to acquire knowledge about successfully carrying out research and to develop the skill of identifying research gaps through conducting a literature review. It also aims to help in identifying research questions, objectives, hypotheses, and the required statistical techniques, while enabling learners to understand the process of collecting relevant data, analyzing it, and interpreting the results. Furthermore, it focuses on preparing final research reports by strictly following research and publication ethics.

### **COM-6001 Basic Econometrics**

Basic econometrics course is designed to acquire foundational knowledge of regression analysis and to develop skills in applying regression models to data. It also aims to build an understanding of diagnostic testing related to regression models, while enabling learners to master basic econometric techniques for the analysis of cross-section data. Furthermore, it focuses on helping learners acquire basic time series analysis and forecasting skills using econometric and event study methodology.

### **COM-6002 Qualitative Research**

The objective is to acquire knowledge about the importance of carrying out qualitative research and to understand the process involved, including identifying relevant areas, developing research questions, and framing appropriate interview questions. It also aims to enable learners to develop active listening skills during interviews and focus group discussions, encouraging participants to provide relevant and in-depth information. Furthermore, it focuses on engaging in preliminary interviews in classrooms and improving skills through listening, reviewing, and understanding how to record interviews, along with conducting mock interviews and role-plays for better clarity before final interviews. Additionally, it involves learning various methods of analyzing qualitative data to identify themes and provide appropriate interpretations, and ultimately preparing and submitting a qualitative research report.

### **COM-6003 Business Analytics**

The objective is to apprise learners of the business analytics process and provide exposure to relevant applications and programming used in business analytics. It also aims to develop expertise in using data visualization tools and techniques to obtain meaningful business insights, while training learners in Python. Furthermore, it focuses on enabling learners to apply machine learning techniques effectively.

### **COM-6004 Data Insights and Analytics**

The objective is to enable learners to identify the data types used in analytics and to enhance their skills in applying relevant statistical and analytical tools for both primary and secondary data. It also aims to provide thorough training in various data analytical software such as R, Tableau, and spreadsheets, while enabling learners to create interactive visualizations for better insights using a range of visualization tools.

### **COM-6401 Personal Financial Planning and Wealth Management**

The objective is to familiarize students with the fundamentals, scope, and process of personal financial planning and wealth creation, while enabling them to understand insurance, retirement, taxation, and estate planning as essential components of financial security. It also aims to develop the ability to apply investment and risk management principles for effective portfolio construction, and to equip students with the skills to formulate integrated wealth management strategies for sustainable financial growth.

### **COM-6402 Indirect Taxes**

The objective is to explain the evolution of indirect taxation and the transition to the GST framework, while helping learners understand the structure, components, and key provisions of GST laws. It also aims to apply the practical aspects of GST compliance, including registration, invoicing, input tax credit (ITC), returns, and refunds, and to analyze the provisions of the Customs Act and Tariff Act relating to valuation and duty computation. Furthermore, it focuses on demonstrating knowledge of assessment, demand, and recovery procedures under GST and Customs, and evaluating the economic and administrative rationale of GST in comparison to the pre-GST regime.

### **COM-6403 E-Filing of Income Tax Returns for Individual Assesseees**

The objective is to provide a conceptual understanding of the income tax framework relevant to individual assesseees, while familiarizing learners with online registration, Aadhaar linking, and the use of the e-filing portal. It also aims to train students in the preparation and e-filing of ITR–1 and ITR–2 for individual taxpayers, and to equip them with the ability to handle verification, rectification, and post-filing compliance activities.

### **COM-6404 Computerized Accounting**

To introduce students to computerized accounting using Tally. 2. To provide hands-on skills for recording transactions, managing ledgers, and generating reports. 3. To prepare financial statements and inventory reports using Tally. 4. To enhance error rectification, bank reconciliation, and MIS reporting skills.

## **SEMESTER - IV**

### **COM-6201 Advanced Econometrics**

The objective is to enable learners to apply cross-section regression models to limited dependent variables, while also helping them acquire time series modeling and forecasting skills using advanced analytical techniques for analyzing both short-term and long-term relationships among variables of interest. It further aims to enhance skills in the estimation and forecasting of volatility, and to provide the ability to build panel data models for examining dependency relationships among financial variables.

### **COM-6202 Environmental Social and Governance Principles and Practice**

The objective is to provide learners with the fundamental principles of ESG and to enable them to understand the functioning of the board and its responsibilities towards ESG practices. It also aims to analyze the risks associated with CSR practices and demonstrate appropriate risk management strategies, while developing insight into the reporting framework and disclosures under ESG.

### **COM-6203 Cost Management and Control**

The objective is to familiarize students with the concepts, techniques, and strategic importance of cost management in decision making, while developing an understanding of cost control, cost reduction, and cost avoidance techniques in modern business environments. It also aims to enable students to apply analytical tools such as Activity-Based Costing, Target Costing, and Transfer Pricing for effective managerial decisions, and to equip them with quantitative and optimization techniques like network analysis, transportation, and assignment problems for achieving cost efficiency and optimal resource utilization.

### **COM-6204 Treasury and Forex Management**

The objective is to familiarize students with the framework, structure, and decision-making processes involved in treasury management, while helping them understand the structure of the forex market and the mechanism of exchange rate determination. It also aims to equip students with knowledge of the fundamentals and managerial aspects of foreign exchange management in business organizations, and to develop a practical understanding of forex trading mechanisms, hedging tools, and settlement procedures.

### **COM-6205 International Financial Management**

The objective is to understand international finance, monetary systems, and global financial instruments, while familiarizing students with financing, investing, and working capital decisions in multinational corporations (MNCs). It also aims to help learners understand foreign exchange markets and the factors influencing exchange rates, and to develop the skills required to manage foreign exchange exposure and risk effectively.

### **COM-6206 Corporate Valuation**

The objective is to provide an in-depth understanding of the principles, context, and approaches to corporate valuation, while developing analytical skills to apply enterprise discounted cash flow (DCF) and relative valuation models in real-world contexts. It also aims to enable learners to evaluate valuation biases, uncertainties, and complexities that influence corporate worth, and to equip students with the ability to assess value creation, enhancement, and reporting practices in accordance with professional and regulatory standards.

### **COM-6207 Banking and Financial Institutions**

The objective is to understand the structure, evolution, and regulatory framework of the Indian banking system, along with the role of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). It also aims to explain the relationship between banking operations and the overall economy, including monetary policy instruments and modern banking services, while enabling learners to analyze the asset and liability management (ALM) framework, risk management practices, and regulatory norms applicable to banks in India. Furthermore, it focuses on examining the role and functioning of major financial institutions and non-banking financial institutions (FIs/NBFIs) in supporting economic development.

### **COM-6208 Corporate Mergers and Acquisitions**

The objective is to understand the fundamental concepts of corporate restructuring and the various forms of mergers and acquisitions, while analyzing the theoretical foundations behind mergers, including efficiency, signaling, and agency theories. It also aims to examine different types of mergers and the typical processes involved in mergers and acquisitions, and to evaluate various takeover defenses.

### **COM-6209 Management of Financial Services**

The objective is to explain the structure, legal aspects, and procedures of leasing, while analyzing the mechanisms, types, and legal frameworks of factoring. It also aims to familiarize students with venture capital financing, including its stages and modes, and to introduce the key roles and functions of investment banks and stock brokers along with the services they offer.

### **COM-6210 Financial Risk Management**

The objective is to understand the concepts, types, and principles of risk and risk management, while enabling learners to assess and manage financial and business risks effectively. It also aims to evaluate and mitigate credit risk, and to analyze and control operational risk.

### **Objectives, Roles and Responsibilities of College Internal Complaints Committee**

1. Prevent discrimination and sexual harassment, by promoting gender amity among students and employees;
2. Deal with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the victimized and termination of the harassment; The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 came into being after it was passed in the Parliament of India.

It should be noted that according to the Supreme Court guideline Sexual harassment can be defined as “unwelcome” sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

1. Physical contact and advances;
2. Demand or request for sexual favours;
3. Sexually coloured remarks;
4. Showing pornography; and
5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature. (Vishaka judgment by Supreme Court)

- **The following is also sexual harassment and is covered by the Committee:**

- Eve-teasing
- Unsavory remarks,
- Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,
- Innuendos and taunts,
- Gender based insults or sexist remarks,
- Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like,
- Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- Forcible physical touch or molestation and
- Physical confinement against one’s will and any other act likely to violate one’s privacy.

The Committee shall meet as often as may be needed and appropriate.

## 2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

The NSS Unit of MES Vasant Joshi College of Arts and Commerce has actively engaged students in a diverse range of community service and developmental activities, fostering a spirit of social responsibility and leadership.

### 3. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

There are 3 divisions/ wings of NCC in M.E.S. Vasant Joshi College viz, **Army Boys Wing, Army Girls Wing and Naval Wing**. Army Boys Wing and Naval Wing are available for boys (SD) and girls (SW). NCC is open to all regular students of the college on a voluntary basis. Total training period is three years. The Library Facilities are also extended to the public. The Library has Book Bank Facility wherein set of Textbooks are given to needy and meritorious students. Students are given two library cards to borrow books for a period of 08 days. Rules and Regulations of the Library are displayed on the Library Notice Board.

**Laboratories:** The college has well-equipped laboratories, namely, IT Lab, Psychology Lab and Economics Lab.



**Sports:** The sports facilities include gymnasium, gymkhana/ multi-purpose hall for indoor games, football ground, volleyball court and two basketball courts.

**Stationery Shop:** The college has a stationery shop which also provides photocopying and printing facilities.

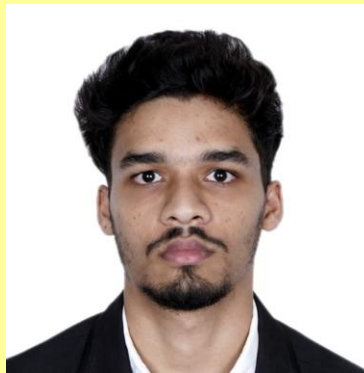
